Constitution of the Gay People's Alliance

## Purpose

The purpose of this organization is to end repression of area homosexuals. The group hopes to accomplish this in the folloming ways: by establishing educational programs designed to correct popular misconceptions conceming homosexuals, by working for the repeal of laws which discriminate against homosexuals, and by offering an altermative to the stereotyped homosexual environment. This organization aims to abide by all the rules, regulations, and laws to which it is subject.

## Wemberghin

Students, faculty, and staff of the University of Temessee are eligible for membership.

## Qfficers

The officers and their duties are as follows two co-chairpersons, a man and a woman, preside over mectings and co-ordinate the activities of the group; the treasurer manages the finances of the organization; and the secretary keeps the minutes of the meetings. To be eligible to serve as an officer a student must not be on academic probation at the time of election or during the term of office.

## Dlactions

Officers are elected at the first meeting of each quarter by a majority of members present. When an election is held the names of the new officers must be transmitted to the Student Activities Office within one week.

- Mactings

Neetings are held veekly.

Dishursoment of Imads
All funds will be received and disbursed through the Business Office if this orçanization receives University Programs and Services fee Funds. In case of the dissolution of this organization all money in the treasury will be equally divided and disbursed to all members.

Ihis organization works at all times in conjunction with at least one nember of either the faculty or the administration of the University of Tennessec serving in the capacity of faculty advisor.

New Constitution
This new constitution was drafted to correct obvious inadequacies in the orisinal constitution. We do not believe these changes make our organization less eligible for recognition by the University.

## Statement of Purpose

The purpose of this organization is to end repression of area homosexualo. The Eroup hopes to accomplish this in the following ways: (A) By establishing educational prosrams desimned to correct. popular misconccptions concerning homosexmals.
(B) By working for the repeal of laws which discriminate against homosexuals.
(C) By developing a social climate which offers the homosexual community an alternative to the stereotyped homosexual environment.

I't should be emphasized that it is a primary aim of this organization to abide by all the rules, re§ulations, and laws to which it is subject. Furthermore, the orcanization takes great care to conduct itself in a manner conducive to thought rather than angor.

## Membership

During our operation as a recognized student organization only students, faculty, anc staff of The University of Tennessee are eligible for membership. During our operation as an offacampus organization there are no membership. restrictions.

Intenested persons become members upon being approved by acclamation and paying the membership fee.

In the event that any member's conduct interferes with the proper function of the cribanization his or her membership may be revoked (without remuneration of the nembcrship fec) by a majority vote of the members present at a regular
meeting desicuntod for such purpose at a previous regular meoting. Porsons sympathetic with the purpose of the organization but who are unable or unvillins to take an active part may be accorded honorary membership by a majority voto of the members present at a recular meeting. These honorary

## Steerinc Committee

There is a permanent stecring committee which consists of the officers, faciity aiviser(s), and five other members who are elected as outlined in the
next section. Others may attend meetings of this committee. The steering comaitive ceets when the officers, a faculty adviser, or a significant number of monbons feel such a necting is necessary. It is not necessary for all memo
bers of the steering comnittee to be present in order for a meeting to be
held; however, in order to assure that all interested persons are given a chance to participate, each impending stecring comaittee meeting is announced at the prececding reguiar meeting. The necessity of announcing these meetings is over-ruici, however, if an emergency situation exists. This committee has only an adovisory capacity and is required to give a full report of each meeting at the next regular meeting of The. U.T. Gay Liberation Front.

## Ejections

Officers and members of the steering committee are elected at the last reguian rectinc of each quarter by a majority of members present. To ensure full participation, a formal reminder of the impending election is issued at the previous mecting. In the event that no candidate for a particular position. receives a aajority of the vote, a runoff election is held at the same meetinc between the two leading candidates.

The officens and members of the stearing committee normally hold their posim tions for the duration of the quarter. In the event that an officer or member of the steerinc comittee is no longer capable of carrying out his or her duties, he or she is replaced as soon as possible by a majority vote of the zembers present at a regular mecting designated for such purpose at a previous recilar mecting. In adaition, if an officer or member of the steering commitieo moves incompetont he or she may be relieved of his or her position by a mojnitity vote of the nembors present at a regular meeting designated for such purpose at a provious regular meeting.

Recular meetings are held once a week at such time and place that meeting facilitics are available. All mecting dates are annuunced one week beforehend. Special meetinfs are held if at a previous regular meeting it is considered advisable by a majority of members present. These special meetings are conducted in the sorne manner as regular meetings but no official business is conductied. Whenever a meeting is held on officer, a faculty adviser, or somcone appointed by one of the comchairmen must be present to preside over the meating. All meetings are public.

## Kembershin Fee ${ }^{\prime}$ <br> \& <br> Dishursement of Funds

Whe membexship fee is paid at the begimning of each quarter and does not exceed five dollans per quarter. The cxact anount of the fee is deternined for the ensuinc quarter by a majority vote of the members present at the last recular meeting of each quarter. The amount of the membership fee for the first quarter that this organization is officially in existence shall be cetermined at the second regular meeting of that quarter.

Duininc our operation as a recognized student organization all funds are received by and disbursed through the University Student Activities and Organizations Board.

No expenditures of the organization's funds exceeding five dollars may be made Without the consent of a majority of the members present at a regular meeting. Exyenaitures of five dollars and less may be made by the officers, members of the steering committee, committee chairmen, and any other member appointed by the aforementioned.

Th caso of the dissolution of this organizationg all money in the treasury will bo equally divided and disbursed to all members.

The U.T. Gay Liberation Front, when operating as a recognized student orgonination, works in conjunction with one or more members of the University of Fomersco faraltis serving in the capacity of facuity adviser(s).

It must be stressed that it shall be a primary aim of this oreanization to meticulously abide by all rules and regulations to which it shall be subject. Firtiermore, in advancing the causc of homosexual occeptance, this orfarization shall take erreat care to conduct itself in a manner conducive to thomfint rathor than an\%rir.
III. Btucients and faculty members shall be cligible for membership. Interested persons shail become members unon beinir approved by acclamation and payinf the momber. shirodues. In the lulikely event that any member's conduct should interfere with tine suceessfiil function of the orfanjaztjon, his or her membership shall be revoked (without remuneration of the membership fee) by a majority vote of the monbers prosent at a refiuiar meetiner previously designated at a regular neeting For suci purpose. For the sake of organization, the original three memoers shall io the original tincee officers as naned in section VI. Persons sympathetic with tho purposes of the orranization, but who do not wish to talie an active part, may be accoried honorary membership by a majority vote of members present at a roglian receting. jnese honorary members shall have no influence over the function of the oreanjzation.

A. ince president shall proside over meotines and, upon consultine with the other ofiscers, amoint committecs, and committee choimmen.

'jo enbire fill participation, a formal reminder of the inpending election shall be issuad at the provious regular meting. In the event that no member receives a :ajojority of the vote, a run-off clection will be held between the two leading camaiatcs. The officers and member of the steerinc committec shall normally hold their position for the duration of the quarter. However, in the event that an ofincer or member of the steerinf committee should no longer be capable of carryinc out his or her duties, he or she shall be replaced as soon as possible by a majority vote of the menbers present at a regular meeting previously designated at a refular neeting for such purpose. likewise, an officer or member of the steerinf committee felt. to be incapable of carrying out the duties of office may be regured to resifn in like manner. However, these rules for the election and terms of oficers shall roi, apply (with the exception of the provision for the forced resifnation of jncompetent officials) durine $\because / i n t e r$ © inarter 1971. To ensure that this orfanization be formed promptly and officiently, the oricinal officers shall be arbitrarily chosen by the franers of the constitution. These shall be:

St musi be stressed that, should one of thec three original officers be considered uncatisffectory, he may be forced to resifn from office and be replaced as outlined above.
