A LOOK AT KNOXVILLE'S PRIDEFUL HISTORY



Stonewall was an accident, a necessary and glorious accident. No one organized the riots in New York's Greenwich Village; a growing crowd instinctively chose to fight back against the repression they had suffered for decades. History gathered itself in a storm and vented its fury through the gays, lesbians, queens, hippies, and other assorted freaks who pelted the police with anything they could find. Between June and early July of 1969 the series of riots that we now refer to as "Stonewall" changed the LBGT community forever.

Stonewall was a pivotal moment for gays – we realized our solidarity and sadly recognized the depth of our mistreatment by the homophobic world. The world has changed since 1969 and the ground the LBGT community has gained is clearly recognizable to anyone. Perhaps we no longer need the violence of Stonewall, yet the event is a symbol for what all queers have achieved, and it stands as a reminder of where we started.

Knoxville Pride has a rich history beginning in the 1980's. The first organized Pride event in Knoxville resulted through the work of Knoxville's Ten Percent. Ten Percent's calendar was active for the entire year and the first Pride week in June featured a masquerade tea-dance and an art exhibit at the Candy Factory. The Metropolitan Community Church of Knoxville started a tradition that year with a potluck picnic.

In 1991, Knoxville Pride became an official organization. Michael Smith, James Talent, and Corky Rees, organized a small group of people to rally behind the "Unity and Diversity" theme. Heritage Night was hosted by Sam Lowe who presented a history of Knoxville's gay bars and Mallory Bishop was crowned Miss Knoxville Pride 1991. More than 500 people attended the 1991 Pride Parade and the

Ted Bandy became president of KPI in 1992. The theme for the second Knoxville Pride was "True Colors Shining Through". In 1993 James Tallent led KPI. KPI sponsored a bus trip to the Gay March on Washington and Tina Chandler became Miss Knoxville Pride. The 1994 version of KPI celebrated the 25th anniversary of Stonewall with the call "It's About Time!" KPI took on a more professional look as Pride Director Gary Elgin published a Pride Guide and secured more community sponsorship.

Last years' theme "Got Pride? Take Action!" was a motivating one and the Knoxville LBGT community took it to heart. Around 2,000 GLBT and supportive individuals crowded World's Fair Park in celebration as Knoxville Pride marched down the streets of Downtown Knoxville and into the Park for the largest Rally and Festival yet. And Pride Week had grown again, as more activities were added to the weeklong list of events.

We are most certainly stronger united in our cause than we are divided, and as we pay tribute to our fore runners it's a reminder that what we do now determines the future. We need to leave future gay Knoxvillian's a strong legacy of leadership, commitment, selflessness in devotion to community, and above all the pride that we all hopefully feel for ourselves and others in our community.

The 2000-2001 KPI Board of Directors has worked very hard "Makin' It Happen" in East Tennessee. They have taken past successes and failures and learned from them, creating a more direct route to the prideful future we all envision. The Board of Directors challenges each one of you to find some way to get involved. Together, Knoxville will go in the history books for "Makin' It Happen" in East Tennessee.
